

The author didn't add enough detail in each clue to keep me guessing. I could almost always figure out what was coming next. The clues were way to easy to solve. For example, Jessie the second oldest girl, found a clue in her fortune cookie that was sitting on top of her ice cream. Inside was a picture gram that was too easy. I figured out what it meant before the children did. I think the author should have made the clues a little more challenging for the readers.

The only reason I enjoyed this story was Benny. He is the youngest child of the boxcar children, who are orphans. He had a good sense of humor that made me laugh. For example one time while Benny was waiting for his fortune cookie, he yelled, "Where's my cookie?" Right there in the middle of the restaurant which made every one laugh.
